

CMS Readiness Dashboard

- The dashboard aims to provide a *general framework* for monitoring community, district, and school level metrics.
- Our key area of focus continues to be the health, safety, and well-being of our students, employees, and our community. Families and staff will be notified when a confirmed positive COVID-19 case occurs at their school. Close contacts will get additional notification if their child has been in close contact with someone who tests positive for the COVID-19 virus. - This dashboard includes positive test data from both the county and families who self-report, and that information is cross-referenced. The county does not report to CMS instances when a CMS student tests positive if the student has not been attending school in-person for 14 days prior to testing positive, because there is not a risk of transmission in the school setting. The dashboard also does not include reporting on students who are enrolled in Virtual Academy. Therefore, the number of positive cases reported should not be interpreted to represent the actual number of CMS students who have tested positive.

* Number of schools are general guidelines and will vary based on the current number of schools at which in-person learning is occurring in addition to other relevant factors.

All metrics in green: Follow recommendations of Mecklenburg County Public Health. One or more metrics in yellow (and no metrics in red): District will consult with Mecklenburg County Public Health for recommendations for additional safety protocols. One or more metrics in red: Evaluate the need for additional safety protocols in collaboration with Mecklenburg County Public Health.

*Numbers are only general guidelines and will vary based on the size of classes, number of individuals attending in-person at a school, and the results of case investigation and contact tracing processes, including specifically whether the cases attended while infectious and whether they are all linked to a specific exposure (e.g. same classroom).

**Students attending Virtual Academy not included in case counts.

***Clusters are defined as 5 or more potentially linked cases within 14 days.
