TRADITIONAL Camps

Traditional camps offer weekly theme-based activities along with fun-filled field trips. Campers will have the opportunity to explore daily outdoor fun, hands-on activities and tons of summer camp fun!

WEEKLY THEMES:

Week 1: Studio Sampler: This Studio Sampler week is the way to start things off right. This week will give campers a chance to try out several different art mediums to see what they like. The studio activities will range from designing different kinds of slime and activities involving paint creations. Does your young artist love to get messy with paint? Do you hate to clean after them? Then this is the perfect week for you and your child! Best of all...no clean-up for parents!

Week 2: Soccer: Back by popular demand. Soccer (futbol), is quickly becoming the sport of choice. Campers will learn a variety of kicks, dribbling methods, and player positioning during these sessions. This sport can be played indoors or out. They may also showcase their skills in a friendly competition.

Week 3: Fourth of July Stars & Stripes: Fourth of July is a holiday that all kids love to celebrate with all of the parades! This week's fun and easy Fourth of July crafts will help enhance the fun of the day. Make some great stars and stripes as campers have an appreciation of patriotism. Have fun being patriotic and Happy 4th of July!

Week 4: Outdoor Adventures: Campers will have fun with developing critical thinking skills while engaging in a number of team building activities. Don't waste another summer playing video games and sitting around twiddling your thumbs! During Outdoor Adventures week, campers will be pushed to new heights as they conquer the physical challenge of friendly competition.

Week 5: Friend Brigade: Campers will have fun learning the different themes of citizenship, including honesty, respect, responsibility. This will encourage and teach them how to contribute positively within their community.

Week 6: Basketball: Campers will enhance their knowledge and skills through this exciting week of Skills & Drills. Campers will research the history of the game, rules and regulations all while honing their skills through a variety of drills. They may also showcase their skills in a friendly competition.

All summer camps are licensed by the North Carolina Division of Child Development and can receive families with subsidies through Child Care Resources, Inc. (CCRI). Staff to student ratios are 1:19 or 2:25.

- Families are responsible for transportation to and from the camp.
- ASEP Summer Camp is open for current CMS students only. Students who have completed Kindergarten through age 12 are eligible to attend.
- **Summer Camps are closed on Monday, June 20th and Monday, July 4th**

HOW TO ENROLL:

The following requirements are needed in order to complete enrollment in the ASEP Summer Camp:

1. Complete all information on the registration form. Enroll for all weeks, some weeks, or some weeks at one site and some at another. **Cost \$135.00 per week per student attending ASEP summer camps.**
2. Enclose a copy of your confirmation payment through our Unity FI Solutions payment system. (Deposit not required of families with CCRI funding). All payments for summer camp will be processed through this system. We will **NOT** accept on-site payments with checks or money orders.

- A \$47 per family registration fee is required only if children are **not** currently enrolled in the ASEP.
- A \$20 per week (non-refundable/non-transferable) deposit for summer camp will reserve a space for your child. The remaining balance will be due each Friday for the upcoming week your child attends.
- Upon receipt of a CCRI family registration, the ASEP will obtain a voucher directly from CCRI through the NC Fast system. ***CCRI, McKinney Vento (MCV) and DSS families must submit registration to the ASEP Central Office no later than June 10, 2022 in order to have vouchers in place for service.**
- Families with CCRI co-payments will be responsible for making weekly fee payments through Unity FI Solutions payment system.
- No additional activity fees will be charged.
- **ASEP CENTRAL OFFICE REGISTRATION ENDS on June 15, 2022 and BEGINS at each summer camp location on June 16, 2022.**
- **Fees are non-refundable/non-transferable after May 13, 2022.**

Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools 2022 After School Enrichment Program Summer Camps Discipline and Behavior Management Policy

Disruptive behavior in the After School Enrichment Program Summer Camp makes it difficult to provide appropriate supervision of your child. Therefore any student who repeatedly disobeys the rules will be referred to the Camp Director.

The discipline procedure will be as follows:

1. The first referral will result in a conference among the Camp Counselor, Camp Director and the child. The Camp Counselor will write a note explaining the disruptive behavior and the action that was taken to try to stop the inappropriate behavior. A verbal contract with the child will be reached and the parent will be informed about the incident and agreement.
2. After the second written referral, the Camp Director will call the parent. The behavior of the child will be discussed and the parent will be asked to participate in resolving the problem.
3. If a third referral is necessary, the parent will be called by the Camp Director, and a conference scheduled. Depending on the severity of the situation, the child may or may not remain in the program until a conference is held and a decision is reached.
4. After the conference, the ASEP Director will determine whether or not the child's behavior will result in exclusion from After School Enrichment Program Summer Camp.
5. If a child is excluded s/he might not be considered for re-enrollment.

In the event of an incident involving an assault, a weapon, alcohol, or an illegal substance, the ASEP Director and Camp Director may choose to revert to the CMS Students Rights and Responsibilities Handbook consequences guidelines if necessary to assure a safe and orderly environment for all children.

WE DO NOT:	WE DO:
Spank, bite, pinch, punch, pull, slap, or otherwise physically punish children. Make fun of, yell at, threaten, make sarcastic remarks about, use profanity, or otherwise verbally abuse the children. Deny food or rest as punishment. Place the children in locked rooms, closets, or boxes as punishment. Allow discipline of children by children. Criticize, make fun of, or otherwise belittle children, their parents, families, or ethnic groups. Shame or punish children when bathroom accidents occur.	Praise, reward, and encourage children. Reason with children and set limits. Listen to the children. Model appropriate behavior. Modify the classroom environment to attempt to prevent problems before they occur. Treat children as people and respect their needs, desires and feelings. Explain things on their level. Provide alternatives for inappropriate behavior. Provide the children with natural and logical consequences of their behavior. Stay consistent in our behavior management.
